The School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning (SGSUP) invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position with advanced expertise in social science research methods and statistics. Anticipated start date is August 2018. This position is part of a cluster of hires, in collaboration with ASU's Institute for Social Science Research (<https://issr.asu.edu>), to advance the university's global leadership in social science methods innovation and training. We seek applicants with an established record of research that deploys advanced social science research methods to study pressing social questions that fit the intellectual mission of the School (<https://geoplan.asu.edu/>), and with a capacity to teach advanced statistics to undergraduate and graduate students in the range of social science programs. We are looking for someone passionate about teaching an undergraduate course on applied multivariate statistics for social sciences, and someone whose areas of research are in urban planning or geography.

The successful candidate will teach advanced social science research methods and statistics (graduate and undergraduate levels), provide mentorship to undergraduate and graduate students, conduct collaborative research, generate peer-reviewed research and external-funding, engage in service to the university and profession, and develop productive relationships with faculty both within and beyond the School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning.

Initial deadline for accepting applications is **November 2, 2017**. If not filled, reviews will occur every two weeks thereafter until the search is closed.
